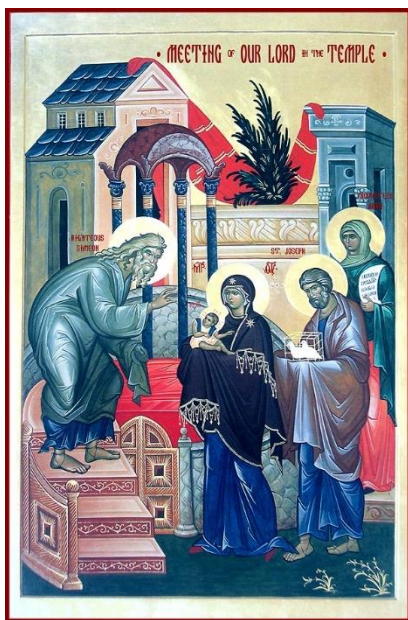

From Your Pastor . . .

Psalm 36:4-5 (LXX) says, “Delight yourself in the Lord; And He will give you the desires of your heart. ⁵Commit your way to the Lord, Trust also in Him, and He will do it.” “Delight” in this context means that we *take pleasure* and *enjoy* the things of God. So, we must ask ourselves this question before moving forward in these verses. Do we immerse ourselves, our lives with Godly things? Do we have a yearning to know Him better? When we genuinely love someone, we will do whatever it takes to show them that this is so. Writing these verses, King David is saying that the Lord will give us our desires when we *commit* our lives and place our *trust* in Him. When we do this, we will see that the “desires” of our hearts are really what God desires for us. Do we really love God? Our outlook on life will be different when we desire to know and love Him more. This is my desire for all of us.
