

Inspiration from the Louhs – Friday September 10th, 2021

“And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose.”

Romans 8:28

Though we often make choices in our lives that we wish we could go back and do differently, the truth is we cannot evaluate our choices in the *past*, with the knowledge and wisdom we have in the *present*. Life is an evolution of learning. Despairing over our past, only hurts our opportunity to live well in the present. And God has dreams, aspirations and goals for every relationship we are in, including the relationship we are in with ourselves.

But the enemy would love nothing more than to disrupt this incredibly important relationship that has the power to affect everything we do, including our purpose. When we give the enemy a foothold in our lives, by speaking to ourselves in self-defeating ways, (using shame and unproductive guilt to deal with our past), it creates dissonance within our soul. This dissonance subtly corrupts how we think and feel about ourselves and robs us of our worth. But God calls us toward self-compassion, to view our lives through a lens of Biblical love. This love is not earned, has no conditions, and is freely given. Therefore, “be sober-minded and watchful. Our

adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour,” 1 Peter 5-8. So if you are struggling with shame, struggling to let go of the mistakes of your past, refuse despair, refuse guilt and refuse to look at your life with judgment.

We simply cannot evaluate a decision of our past, with wisdom that could have only been gained by the growth that has brought us to the present. So, keep God’s voice of love, peace, mercy and hope as the foundation for how you speak to yourself. Let your thoughts be guided by love, because “all the ways of the Lord are loving and faithful,” Psalm 25:10. “For I will be merciful toward their iniquities, and I will remember their sins no more,” Hebrews 8:12.
